Dear Judge Bossa,

Thank you for addressing a Dutch audience last night on a topic of great importance: bringing those who commit horrendous crimes to justice.

My name is Edwin Giltay. I am the author of *The Cover-up General* (Dutch: *De doofpotgeneraal*), a documented account of a Dutch military intelligence operation connected to the 1995 Srebrenica genocide. The book was judicially validated by the Court of Appeal in The Hague in 2016 (ECLI:NL:GHDHA:2016:870), and cited as evidence in the Mothers of Srebrenica case against the Dutch State ([memorandum of grievances, page 23](#)).

Following last night's public debate at Amare, The Hague, I would like to include the following paragraph on my website ([thecoverupgeneral.com](#)), and I would welcome your response before doing so:

On 25 March 2026, the author addressed Judge Solomy Balungi Bossa of the International Criminal Court at a public debate in Amare, The Hague (PDF), in sight of the Ministry of Defence.
